We actively support and advance academic research in HEH and HH, while building a strong network for members to exchange knowledge, share expertise, and collaborate on joint initiatives.

NEW LEADERSHIP

In September 2025, the organization marked an important leadership transition, as its long-standing president and founder, Prof. Didier Pittet, passed the role to Dr. Alexandra Peters. Dr. Peters, who has been closely involved with Clean Hospitals since its establishment in 2018, and was the lead in scientific research, now steps into the presidency, continuing to guide the organization's mission forward.

Dr. Peters is an internationally recognized expert in HEH, HH, and infection prevention, with extensive experience in research, innovation, and multi-stakeholder collaboration. As President, she leads the strategic development of Clean Hospitals and actively champions evidence-based approaches to advancing hygiene standards across healthcare settings.

Under her leadership, a dedicated internal team has been established: Martina Močenić, PhD Candidate, MSN, ICN, RN leads the education program, Elleni Rioja, MPH provides administrative and project support, and most recently, Paulo Brois, MSN, DVM, RN supports research efforts as a Scientific Collaborator.

We are also proud to highlight our Scientific Board, composed of internationally renowned leaders in environmental hygiene, including Prof. Brett Mitchell, Prof. David Weber, Prof. Stephanie Dancer, Dr. Pierre Parneix, and Prof. Martin Kiernan alongside two non-voting representatives elected from industry.

WORKING GROUPS

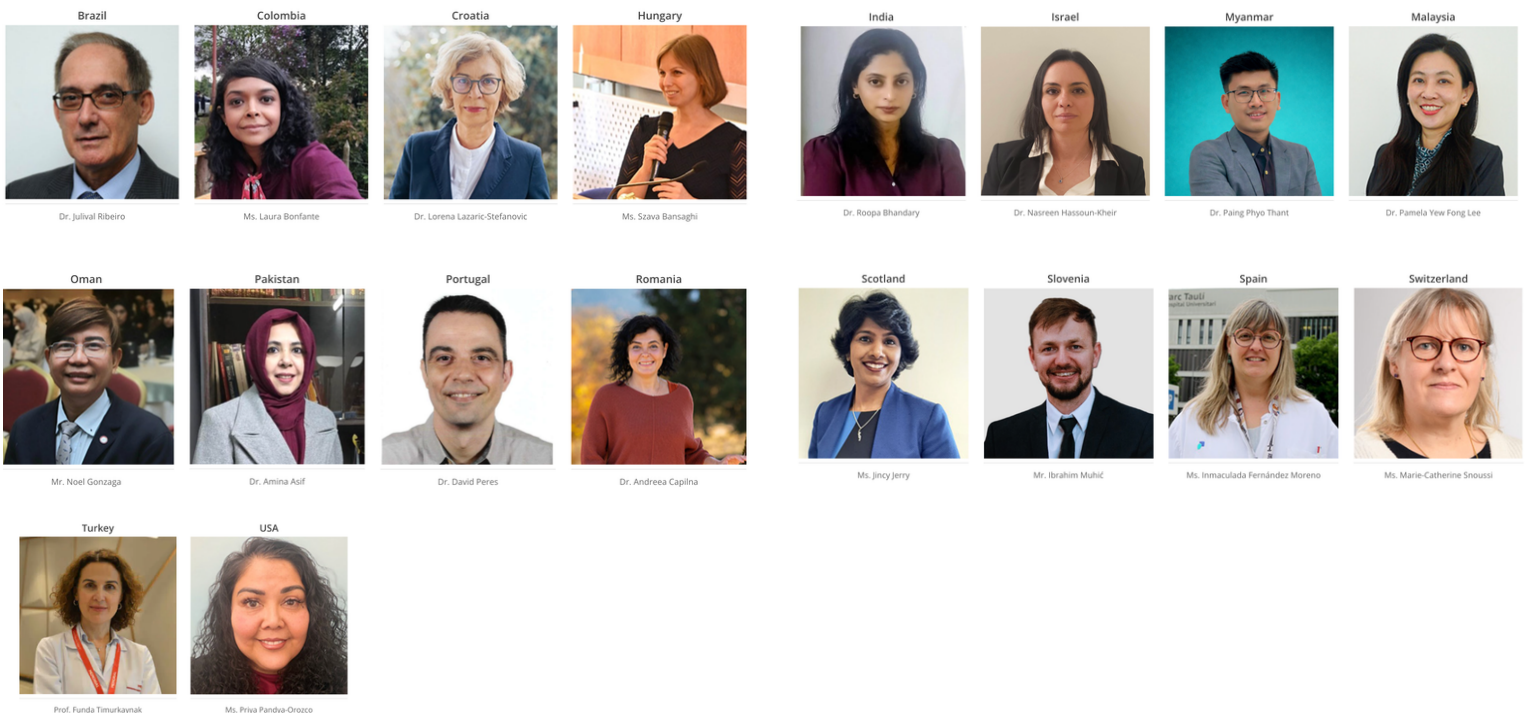

One of our latest developments of Clean Hospitals is the appointment of Country Leads, who play a key role in bringing their country's perspective into the Clean Hospitals network. They contribute to discussions and working groups, helping to ensure that different healthcare systems, cultural contexts, and operational constraints are considered. Another important part of the Country Lead role is acting as a link to encourage engagement between Clean Hospitals and healthcare facilities in their country. They also play an active role in promoting and supporting the celebration of Clean Hospitals Day annually on the 20th of October.
